**Description**: Refuge Hosts serve at Creamer's Field as volunteers of the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, Wildlife Conservation Division. They provide essential services at the Refuge's hub (the 12)

Refuge Host duties include, but are not limited to: Staff the Farmhouse Visitor Center (9:30am to 5pm), greet visitors to refuge, sell gift shop items, maintain visitor use logs, minor litter pickup, minor maintenance. Grounds keeping (mowing and trimming) of about 7 total acres of historic dairy buildings and wildlife

viewing areas. May assist with interpretive programs and other duties

Each duty period consists of 6-7 weeks of long weekends only. Length of duty may flex and depends on coordination with other






