



Field Sketches: Barking Moose



> **Ecology & Conservation of the Breeding Birds** of the Yukon-Kuskokwim River Delta Dr. Mark Lindberg Join Arctic Audubon Society and the Alaska Songbird Institute for their next winter program: Ecology & Conservation of the Breeding Birds of the Yukon-Kuskokwim River Delta by Dr. Mark Lindberg. The program will take place at 7:30 pm on Monday, April 10 at the Carlson Center North Star Room (walk through the Pioneer Room). The speaker will be Dr. Mark Lindberg, a UAF wildlife ecology professor, who will discuss the shorebirds and waterfowl he has studied in the Yukon Delta National Wildlife Refuge since 1990.
