

2024 Design Alaska Wild Arts Walk

Dear Artists,

We are inviting you to participate in the Annual **Design Alaska Wild Arts Walk** organized by Friends of Creamer's Field. The Design Alaska Wild Arts Walk is an annual community event that promotes the unique qualities of Creamer's Field Migratory Waterfowl Refuge as a venue for nature observation and artistic inspiration. Our goals are to encourage visitors to explore Creamer's Field beyond the front fields and to help fulfill the mandate that established Creamer's Field as a community Refuge. The event is a fundraiser for Friends of Creamer's Field's year-round programs and events that promote environmental stewardship and lifelong learning through experience, awareness, appreciation, and conservation of the natural and historic resources of Creamer's Field Migratory Waterfowl Refuge.

This year's event will take place **Sunday, June 23, 2024**, from **11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.** at Creamer's Field, 1300 College Road in Fairbanks. This is a fabulous opportunity to showcase your artistic talents.

Applications for participation must be received by 5p.m. on May 24, 2024 to be considered.

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.

Requirements for Artist Participation:

- Art must be inspired by nature.
- Pay \$20 artist fee.
- Artists will donate 15% of their gross event sales to Friends of Creamer's Field.
- Artists are encouraged to create some of their art onsite as a demonstration to visitors.
- Artist stations must always be manned.

Weather

The event will take place regardless of the weather. **The weather can be variable at this time of year, and we request that you honor your professional commitment to attend.**

Artists' Locations

Artists will be assigned to stations located near the Creamer's Dairy buildings and along the Refuge trails. Stations will be assigned based on preference, needs, and practicality. A "station" is defined as the location where the artist can be found during the event. Artists may move about during the event if they leave a notice at or near their station. Station preferences will be assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis. Submit your application early to secure one of your preferred spots.

Both Set-up Fee

If you would like Friends of Creamer's Field to provide and set up a tent, table, and chairs for you, there will be an additional \$20 booth set-up charge. Please indicate on your application if you will be using this service. You are more than welcome to bring and set up your own booth layout at no additional cost.

Security

No security is provided. Please see the liability release on the application for more information. We will have a limited number of volunteers on hand to provide relief at your station during the event for breaks.

Station Set-up

- Artist check-in will start at 9:00 a.m. on Sunday, June 23rd. Artists are welcome to set up their stations any time after that.
- A limited number of garden carts will be available for the transportation of display materials to stations, but you are welcome to bring your own. Trails are bumpy, so secure your items in your cart.
- Please provide your own tablecloths for your table.
- We recommend that you bring some sort of insect repellent, and possibly a tarp in case of inclement weather.

Sales

Artists donate **15% of gross sales** from the event to Friends of Creamer's Field. Artists are encouraged to sell their work at their stations. Artists who do not have the ability to handle credit card sales can send their customers to a nearby credit station that will be manned by a Friends of Creamer's Field volunteer. VISA, MasterCard, and Discover credit cards are accepted.

Proceeds from sales at the Credit Card Station minus the 2.6% credit card fee and the 15% donation will be remitted to the artists via mail by July 31, 2024, at the latest. Artists will keep a record of any sales made at their station on a form provided by Friends of Creamer's Field and submit it at the end of the event along with 15% of their gross sales.

Artist Biographies

Friends of Creamer's Field will produce and distribute an event program that will include a map of the trails with each station listed accompanied by the artist's biography. On the application, we request that you provide a bio of **50 words or less**.

Artist Services

Friends of Creamer's Field will provide each artist with:

- Promotional materials
- Complimentary passes for up to 2 helpers
- 2024 Wild Arts Walk mug.
- Laminated station signs

- Exhibitor name tags
- Use of a credit station to handle credit card sales.

Event Admission

The general public will pay admission to attend this event, \$5 per person (children 17 and under are free). **Participating artists and up to 2 helpers will not have to pay admission.** Each family that attends receives a Design Alaska Wild Arts Walk collector mug.

Complimentary event passes for artists will be included in the confirmation packets, which will be available the morning of the event when the artist checks in.

Application deadline is MAY 24th!

Artists will be chosen by the planning committee and applications are accepted on a rolling basis. Artists will be notified by May 28, 2024 at the latest.

- provide a 50-word or less artist biography.
- fill out the Station/Set-up Preferences form.
- sign the Release of Liability form.

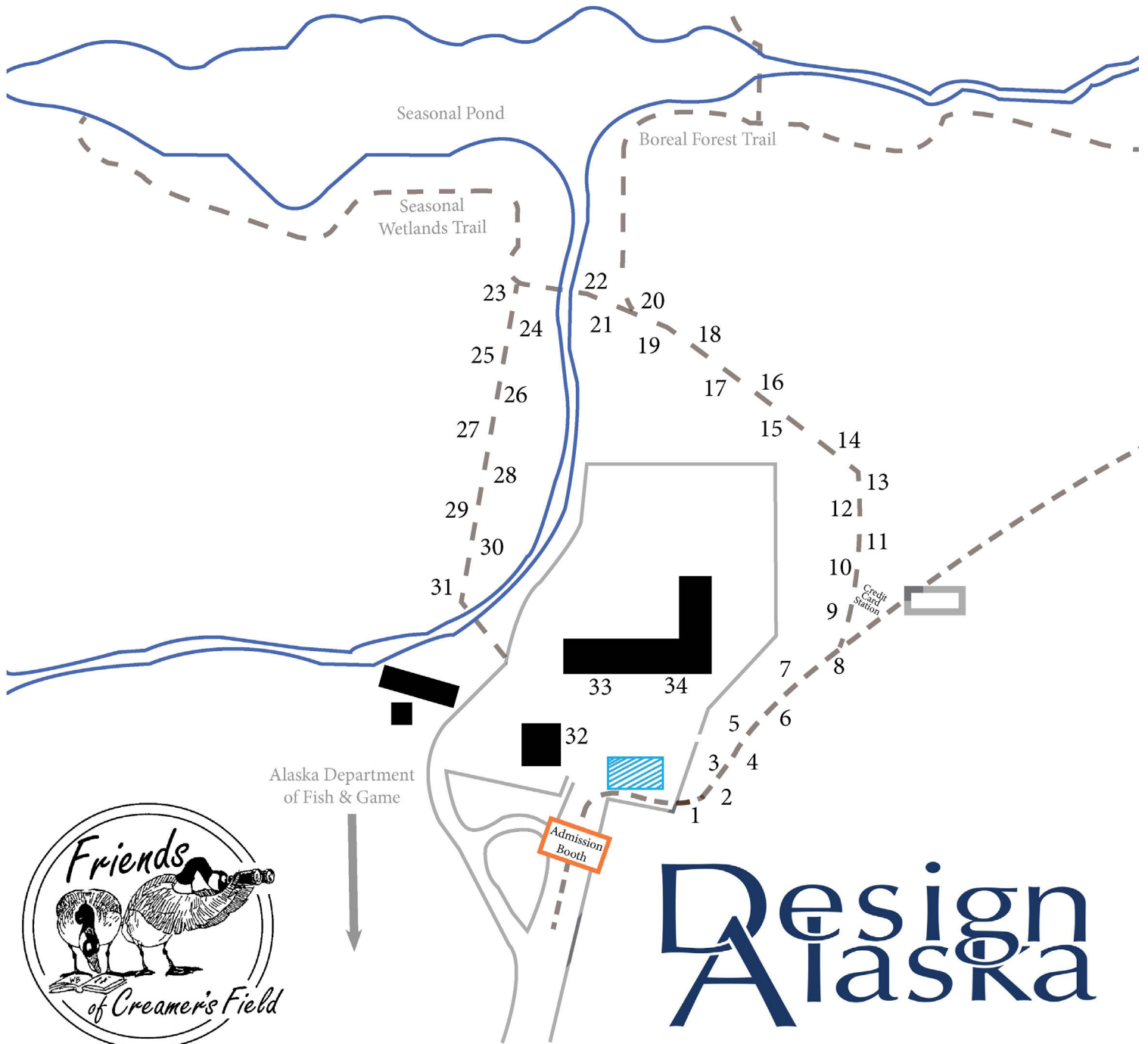
