
Luminary Trail December 7th | 5:00 PM - 8:00 PM


Christmas Bird Count Arctic Audubon December 21st | All Day

Join the local birding community in the 64th Fairbanks Christmas Bird Count on December 21st during the daylight hours! Registration is free and birders of all levels are invited to help! There will be a compilation potluck at 5:30 at Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Fairbanks, 4448 Pike's Landing Road, Fairbanks, AK 99709

From the Arctic Circle to the mountain valleys of the Andes, tens of thousands of people are gearing up to take part in the world's longest-running citizen science project—the Christmas Bird Count. Birders of all levels have been braving the elements to count birds during a three-week period each year since the count began in 1900. Even though the count is somewhat loosely organized, having 124 years of data on bird species and numbers document important trends.

You don't have to live inside the count circle to participate on a field team! It's fun to join other birders to count our avian neighbors, and it contributes valuable scientific data.
